Pastor's Article



Dear Church Family and Friends,

This past Saturday I held our annual Spring Spiritual Retreat at Camp Kum-Ba-Ya. After having to cancel the retreat in 2020 because of Covid and then hosting last year's 2021 retreat on "Celtic Christian Spirituality" on zoom, it was such a blessing to be back on the grounds of KBY, where we have gone yearly since 2011 to learn about different topics (Spiritual Disciplines, Forgiveness, Overcoming Worry, the Changing

Seasons of Our Lives, Discernment and Decision Making, the Cosmic Christ, The Hymn of the Pearl, the Enneagram, Sacred Words and Prayer Beads, and more). I think people have wanted to attend these retreats as much for the opportunity to be in the beauty of nature at KBY as to learn about the topic itself. In any case, Saturday felt like a kind of homegoing after not having been there for two years and it was so healing and wonderful to be there.

I don't know the whole story of how it happened (and it's one I would like to hear the details of) but back in the 1950s our church and First Christian Church of Mayfield together provided the seed money for the purchase of this wooded property on the lake outside Benton that would become one of our KY region's two denominational camps. Over the years, with its simple rustic A-frame cabins (sweltering hot in the summer and I remember more than one pesky mosquito), scores of children, youth, and adults have descended on the camp during the summer months and been transformed as they have caught the Christian faith in the community of friends and the beauty of nature. I've observed how the children and youth at our church look forward to returning year after year and how the friendships they form with their peers and counselors are so important to them. Emily Dawson, now a college student (who unfortunately because of Covid's shutting down the camp was not able to attend her junior and senior years), even wants to go back as a counselor this summer!

Our church not only sends children and youth to summer camp and have provided counselors, but we've hosted our own camps, Mark and Nancy Dycus have overseen family camp (All Y'all Camp), we have our annual spring spiritual retreat there, both the church and CWF give special offerings for the camp's maintenance and programming, and the Disciples Men's Fellowship have especially been involved. Every year the men go for the annual Spring Work Day and help spruce the place up, do repairs, and so much more. I know they were heavily involved in building the bathhouse some years ago. Fred Wells has helped with electrical work. Terry Hart has supplied lumber. Dan McKeel has organized work crews. Gary White helped with the purchase of the new chairs in the lodge that are in memory of David Roos. I think the men are planning on building a deck for the camp manager's home and are exploring purchasing a log splitter. In short, not only did we supply the seed money for the purchase of the camp so many years ago but we have heavily invested ourselves in it over the years. As we should for this beautiful camp on the lake— with its

canoes, sailboats, basketball courts, fire pits, outdoor pavilion, craft lodge, dining hall and kitchen, outdoor worship spaces, hiking trails, and heated and air-conditioned cabins and "vintage" cabins for those who might still like to have the more primitive camp experience—is a gift from God to all of us to be cherished!

Now is an especially important time for us to help with the camp for the most amazing thing has happened. The camp has received the incredibly generous donation of 8 FEMA buildings as a memorial gift in honor of a young boy who loved the camp and sadly passed away. (I will ask the West Area office to share the full story with you of who he was and how this all came to be). These FEMA buildings will be turned into 8 cabins, all of which will have heating and air conditioning. At least two of the cabins also will have their own bathroom facilities. Of course, a few of the "vintage" cabins will be kept. We now can move into having a year-round program! Praise God!

Our new camp manager, Rev. Dee Moore Wells, and her husband Al, gave us a tour on golf carts around the camp when our retreat had finished on Saturday. The camp presently looks like a construction zone with heavy equipment everywhere, some of the cabins up on cement foundation blocks, others waiting to be moved. The insides of the cabins need to be thoroughly cleaned before they can be furnished. The recent tornado and storms have left many trees with branches felled, limbs lying on the ground. Some work needs to be done down at the lake front. And we need to be able to open our doors to campers in June! **There is so much work that needs to be done! We need to ask EVERYONE to help!**

This really is an all-hands-on-deck moment when we need everyone to contribute getting the camp ready in some way. People of all abilities are needed from those who can help gathering up all the wood (and cutting logs), helping with any number of projects on the list that Dee has created (on the next page), to cleaning up the cabins, and even doing things while seated. We have an opportunity on **Saturday, April 23**, **from 8 AM to 2 PM** to help with **clean up**. And then at **2 PM** we can rejoice as we **dedicate the new cabins**, praying that God will continue to send campers to fill them, knowing the transformative power our beautiful campground has in changing people's lives as they become followers of Jesus and then go out to change the world!

And parents and grandparents, please sign up your kids for camp! The camp dates are on page 5. And ask your kids to invite their friends as well! We have plenty of cabins with space ready to fill! There also are some funds available from our church to be able to send campers who might need some financial help. All you need to do is ask!

Pandemic Update

We reopened our sanctuary to worship last Palm Sunday, 2021, after being closed for in-person worship for a year. We have been able to remain open for Sunday morning worship over the past twelve months with the exception of a very few Sundays when we suddenly plunged into a red zone. How exciting it is that we can report that the entirety of Kentucky, with the exception of one county, is now in a green zone! All small groups can now meet in the church buildings. As long as we continue to be in a green zone, masks no longer are required including during singing (of course, some of you may feel you would like to continue wearing them and we will continue to make masks available). As an extra measure of caution, for the time being we will continue to use prefab communion cups and not pass the offering plate. Additionally, starting this Sunday, to make reasonable accommodation for those who may be immune compromised or still concerned about the spread of Covid-19, a very small section of the sanctuary will be cordoned off for you to sit in, with the majority of the sanctuary being open seating. A virtual option will continue to be offered on Facebook Live (also accessible to those who do not have a personal Facebook account) but we will no longer be offering a Zoom option for the worship celebration. We still will continue to keep a close eye on the spread of Covid-10 as a new variant is now circulating. If and when there are changes, we will make course adjustments, which will be published in the weekly Tuesday email. We thank everyone for their understanding and compliance with the safety measures that we have had and will continue to have in place!

In Appreciation of Janet Finch

Many thanks to Janet Finch for sharing her gift of music with us!

Janet has most graciously agreed to play for us two or three Sundays a month and she already has begun practicing with the Chancel Choir. We also greatly appreciate that on the Sundays that she will be away that she has reached out to Dr. Lucia Unrau and Robert Arneson to fill in. As you read the article below that we asked Janet to write introducing herself, you will see that not only did God answer our prayers but God answered them abundantly!

Playing the piano at First Christian Church is a joy to my heart. Each Sunday that I play, I have the opportunity to share something that is so dear to my heart, with a congregation that I have come to love. Before each service, I am in prayer, asking The Lord to take that which is in my heart, let it flow through my fingers, and into the hearts of those listening so that they may be drawn to God.

Growing up in Columbus, Ohio: My father was a great musical inspiration in my life. He was a child prodigy and had a life full of great experiences. His stories of world travel, playing with the big bands, making movies with Hollywood stars, and his times with notables such as Walt Disney and John Steinbeck, inspired big dreams of my own.

Early in life, the piano became my passion and, at age 7, I began formal study. It was at age 15, that I began piano study at Otterbein College with the Chairman of the Piano Department. My practice schedule became more intense and I was invited to perform in recitals at the college. It was at this time that I began teaching piano privately, although that wasn't what I really wanted to do with my life. I loved performance, and said "yes" to every opportunity that came along.

Becoming a Believer: It was in my teen years that God began to bring other Believers alongside me. I had the desire to know God, began reading my Bible and attending church on my own. My mother worked full-time, but she always had Christian families watch over me while she was away. They were kind to include me when attending church and in their church youth group activities. I saw their joy, goodness, and God's design for family life.

Upon high school graduation, I attended The Ohio State University majoring in Piano Performance. I also discovered that I loved accompanying singers. One opera professor became a mentor to me and invited me to her Summer program in Graz, Austria. The faculty was comprised of well-known opera singers from the Metropolitan Opera in New York City. I had the privilege of studying piano, opera coaching, and accompanying with the vocal coach for the Metropolitan Opera that Summer.

It was at OSU, and at age 19, that I made a commitment to Christ, was involved with campus ministry, weekly Bible study, and attended church each Sunday. My closest circle of friends were committed to Christ and together we grew as Christians as well as musicians. I stayed busy accompanying soloists and also had a growing private piano studio, although that wasn't what I wanted to do with my life.

My experience at OSU helped me set professional goals for the future, shape my work ethic, and build personal character. It was in my third year at OSU that the Chairman of the Piano Department at The University of Cincinnati-College Conservatory of Music was invited as a guest artist. He was a specialist in the piano works of Debussy and Chopin and I loved his playing. As a young student I wanted to attend college at CCM. I knew that was the professor with whom I wanted to study. I carried that dream into the future for the next 19 years.

After graduation from OSU, a church friend named "Harry" told me he had someone he wanted me to meet. His best friend was named Monte Finch. At that time, I was interested in someone else, and Monte Finch was 6 hours away in medical school. Harry talked to Monte about meeting "this girl" and his response went something like "no, not after that last girl you fixed me up with-" We eventually did meet and four years later were married. Harry was the best man.

This May 15th, we will celebrate 40 years together. I could not have asked for a greater blessing and life partner than Monte. We both attended OSU for undergraduate school and, as I look back, I see the touch points that only God could have provided for us.

After medical school, internship, residency, and fellowship, we settled in Murray, Kentucky to raise our two toddlers. We attended church regularly. I continued to play the piano for every opportunity which came my way, and also taught private piano lessons.

When our children were older. I began intense piano study again. I tried different universities, but my dream of attending the College-Conservatory of Music in Cincinnati dominated, and I soon realized that nothing would ever do in its place. I contacted the Chairman of the Piano Department and, after 19 years, began study in Cincinnati. Each week I drove 11 hours round trip for one piano lesson. I worked with him one year to prepare my graduate school audition at CCM. At the next round of auditions, I played for their world-renowned artist-piano faculty. It was a daunting experience for a middle-aged housewife from Murray, Kentucky, but there was no backing out. That year they chose 10 pianists from the world, two of whom were from the United States. God answered my prayer, and I was accepted. My second year, I received a graduate assistantship and full scholarship, was also hired to teach in the CCM Preparatory Division working with gifted and talented young people, and also in the Continuing Education Division for adults who wanted to study piano. I worked 19 hours a day to complete my studies, teaching, and practicing each day. The Lord knew that I had an interest in writing and I began doing large research projects on how our brains learn music. As a result, three of my research projects were published in *Clavier* Companion Magazine. I was also invited to be part of The National Committee on Adult Learning which researches and gives presentations nation-wide on adult piano study. It was more than I ever prayed for-

Eventually, God began to close the door on my time at CCM. I was needed at home as a wife and mother. It was a hard transition for me, and I stopped practicing. I devoted long hours to prayer, Bible study, and women's ministry. It was a time of grieving, and a time of God showing me who HE wanted me to be. I had to lay down everything that I wanted for myself, and surrender to His Perfect Will.

Ten years have passed since my time at CCM and I'm now in a new season of my life. I'm back to practicing the piano once again. I am grateful for the opportunity to serve at First Christian Church. And now 50 years later, I am still teaching private piano lessons. I loved teaching at the college level, however, God kept bringing private teaching back to me, and now I'm thankful He did. When possible, I still study piano and piano pedagogy in Austria in my summers. God has been faithful to fill the gaps of things I wanted to do but couldn't before.

Our two children are now grown, and we've added two little granddaughters to our family. Our daughter Stephanie is age 35, an OSHA Specialist in Oak Ridge, Tennessee, and serves as the Director of Safety and Development for an agency who cleans up hazardous waste for the government. Our son Randy is age 34, and a Park Ranger. He recently accepted a position at Yellowstone National Park. He reports in on May 16th.

This is a new season of life which is no longer about my goals and dreams, but about coming alongside others, discipleship, encouragement, and being a "Mary" who loved to listen to The Lord.

During the months of January through March 2022, our church participated in the following outreach efforts:

- Contributed money (\$250) to **Laundry Love** for the month of January. Due to COVID, we no longer work at the laundry mat but lwash cards are given to families through the school's resource centers. Twenty cards are loaded with \$12.50 each and distributed (10 each) to the Murray and Calloway schools. We still partner with St. John's Episcopal Church and First Presbyterian Church for Laundry Love.
- A check was sent to **Week of Compassion** in December for \$1798.49. After receiving many more donations, a check was sent in March for \$2815 designated to **Week of Compassion-West Kentucky tornado recovery efforts**.
- The **Need Line Backpack program** supplies lunch sacks filled with food items on weekends for children who are food insecure.
