Dear Church Family and Friends,

I personally also am trying to catch up with the news I shared with the congregation in a letter on July 3, 2022, that I will be retiring from ministry on August 31, 2022. This is unexpected for me too. My original plan was to enjoy the Christmas Eve Candlelighting and Communion service in our beautiful sanctuary on December 24, 2023, and then bring my ministry to completion in January of 2024 when I reached full retirement age. But, as the Jewish saying goes,

"humans plan, God laughs!" My husband, Russ, who has a muscle degenerative disease they believe is Inclusion-Body Myositis (IBM), is experiencing symptoms that now are affecting his mobility. Since we may only have a limited period of time during which we can travel to see our daughter Rachel and grandchildren, and hopefully even have some other adventures, we are going to take full advantage of each moment of every day to enjoy each other's company, grateful for all that God has blessed us with and still may have in store for us.

I want to thank each and every one of you for the extraordinary opportunity I have had of being your minister for the past 13 ½ years. Never could I have imagined that I would be able to spend my final years in ministry serving in such a life-giving environment, surrounded by the most interesting, caring, faith-filled people, who have allowed me to be just who I am with some strengths and many weaknesses, to express myself freely, to try new things, to sometimes fail but to get up, dust myself off, and move forward. And what a blessing it has been to worship in our beautiful sanctuary, surrounded by the lingering prayers and good works of all those who have preceded us in this space dating back so many years! All this within the context of living in a university town where there are so many opportunities for continued learning and growth. And I would be remiss if I did not mention that it is because I served in this church that I now have my beautiful grandchildren Eliana and Isaac!

I think back over these many years that have included, among many things (and in no particular order chronologically or in importance): our participation in "Surfing the Edge" (which led to our implementing the first "Longest Night - Service of Light" worship celebration in our community on the Winter Solstice); the Celebration Service; Dream Team Meetings; the "Charter for Compassion" gatherings (which helped to give rise to the Need Line Green Bags), "Wednesday Night Live" Gatherings during which so many themes were covered, good conversations had, laughter shared, and delicious food eaten; Baby Dedications; Baby and Bridal Showers; Watchnight Gatherings; Ash Wednesday; Maundy Thursday; Healing Services; Palm Sunday Processions; Easter Sunday; the Hanging of the Greens; the Christmas Eve Candlelighting and Communion Service; Children's

Skits; Youth Sundays; Lock-Ins; our explorations of rural poverty (that led to our trip to Kentucky Cornerstone in Beattyville, KY); our concern about children in urban poverty (leading to our "Connect Forth Worth" Experience in TX); our study of systemic racism (leading to our intergenerational trip to Alabama); Family Camp at KBY; Children's Summer Camp; Thursday Evening "Spirituality Today" studies; over 600 sermons (sorry you had to listen to me drone on!); 26 sermon series on various topics including the controversial "The Bible and the LGBTQ Community"; 12 Spring Spiritual Retreats (10 of which were at Camp KBY); close to 50 funerals (including that of former minister Rev. Dr. David Roos, whose support of my ministry and participation at our church was so incredibly helpful to me, and our beloved organist Donnie Hendrix); Bereavement Meals; Out to Lunch gatherings at local restaurants; Homecoming; Elders Meetings; Board Meetings; Stewardship Finance Committee Meetings; Personnel Committee Meetings; Christian Education Meetings; Church Building Reopening Committee Meetings; CWF Fellowship Gatherings; Mother-Child Banquets; Salad Suppers; Noel Markets; Baptism Receptions; Farewell Receptions; House Blessings; my participation at the occasional DMF meetings; our many Fellowship Meals; Soup and Bread fundraisers; Graduation Sundays; Memorial Day Remembrances; Picnics; the Warming Center; Laundry Love; the Need Line Back Pack Program; Alternative Gifts; Life House Baby Bottles; the collection of School Supplies; snacks for Main Street Youth; Candles for HOPE Calloway; Clutch; Need Line; Angels Attic; Church World Service; Angels Clinic; countless other Outreach Projects and Giving to Ministries Locally, Regionally, and Internationally; Giving to "Week of Compassion"; "Disciples Mission Fund"; "Reconciliation"; Benevolence Fund giving; the sponsorship of an individual and one family for political asylum, celebrating when it was granted; Children's and Youth Ministries; Cooperative VBS; Stewardship Finance campaigns and Fireside Chats; Spring Cleaning; Meal Trains and Prayer Chains; serving on the board of Murray Christian Fellowship; Mission Behind Bars and Beyond; Pride Festivals; Freedom Fest; de-icying the walkways and stairs; decluttering and cleaning; CUBS Meetings; District Meetings; Regional Assembly; the Commission on Ministry; Boundaries Trainings; Anti-Racism - Pro-Reconciliation Training; Hospice Training; Mental Health First Aid Training; "Gather Murray"; over 100 movies viewed during "Faith and Film" followed by discussion over brownies and ice cream; the Moms' Group; our book discussion group at the Round Table at Tom's Grill; Lost Scriptures Series; Mental Health Awareness Studies and speakers; Covid organ concerts; Covid front yard worship followed by Simplicity Sunday parking lot worship, followed by Zoom worship during which many people shared their personal faith journeys; "Midweek Virtual Live" on Zoom to reflect on scripture and poetry; "Sharing Stories about Race in America" Zoom presentations; Celtic Christian Spirituality Studies; Enneagram training; Ethical Will workshop; bulletins; Tuesday emails; Church Life; Facebook; Facebook Live; Zoom: Instagram: the church website; hours and hours of visitation and counseling; at home communion; late night ER visits; Premarital Counseling; Wedding Rehearsals; Weddings; Wedding Vow Renewals; Wedding Receptions; Membership Classes; Sunday School; Sunday worship; my enjoyment of the Chancel Choir on Sundays and their awesome Christmas Cantatas and special Choir Celebration Sunday; my enjoyment of all the Elders' Communion Messages during which I am inspired and learn so much; my enjoyment of the delightful Children's Messages; Baptism Classes; and Baptisms. Whew! The list goes on and on and I'm sure there is much I have left out.

But, when it gets right down to it, I think that what I will cherish most of all are those sacred moments when I would put on waders and, during a worship celebration devoted solely to that one person, gently would lower a person into the waters of the baptistry with the beautiful mosaic behind it, baptizing a person in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and then see the beautiful expressions on their faces as they rose to new life as a follower of Jesus Christ as their church family broke out in applause. What a privilege it has been to experience all of this!

Not only have I been blessed to serve as the minister of what I consider to be the best congregation in the world (since it has the most wonderful people in the world!), but I also have served alongside the best possible staff. Our faithful custodian Aimee Bailey has been a constant since the very beginning, and I always enjoy the times she pops her head into the office to catch up! Nothing could be better than working with our Minister of Music, Mark Dycus, and witnessing the wonderful work he has been doing with the Chancel Choir, working to prepare Special Music, and leading singing with such joy and enthusiasm! All those years with our beloved organist Donnie Hendrix, who dearly loved this congregation, and who loved playing every week alongside Judy Hill! How grateful we presently are for Janet Finch, Dr. Lucia Unrau, and Robert Arneson! Tom Seipel, who sadly left this earth while still so young, did amazing work with our youth and brought new energy! I am grateful for Samuel Underwood, Corey Fletcher, Andrew and Janie Green, and Elena Roberts who also worked with our youth, each of whom left their own unique mark on this ministry! Many thanks for the many years of outstanding ministry by our Children's Director Nancy Dycus! She definitely knows how to throw a party! I appreciate all who have worked with our Children's Worship and Wonder Ministry over the years, strengthened by the leadership of June Vander Molen, who have included Jennifer Donnelly, Elizabeth Dawson Howard, Ashley Dawson, Allison Willis, Amara Anderson, Emily Dawson, and Alyssa Daughrity! It is so wonderful to have Lisa Allen back overseeing the nursery! And then there are the group of administrative assistants who work so hard behind the scenes to keep the church going: Margaret Heath, Amanda Pennington, Debbie Batteiger, and presently the creative and efficient Katelyn Crane who is doing an incredible job! The elders, deacons, and committee chairs have been the best! Thank you to all of you and to each member of the congregation (including all those saints of this church who are now with the Lord) as you have offered your many gifts, continuing to build God's Kingdom in the world through the particular ministry of this church. You are too numerous to name but please know how much I value each and every one of you!

It is hard to be leaving you while we still are struggling with the difficulties wrought by the pandemic. We all thought that it would be over within a month or two. We never thought we would lose Donnie Hendrix, Carolyn Reagan, and Tony Van Dyke to Covid. I never thought we would lose my sister-inlaw Eileen either. We never could have imagined that, just since the beginning of July, 2 years and 4 months after our building first shut down because of the pandemic, seven of our congregants have been quarantined because they have contracted Covid. Thankfully this new variant, even though highly contagious, it is not as dangerous, so the outcome is better, especially for those who have chosen to be vaccinated. Yet the pandemic still is not over. We still are wearing masks. We still are using pre-fab communion cups. We still do not pass the offering plate. We still have a portion of the

sanctuary cordoned off. There still are people who are afraid to return to in-person worship. A number of people have passed away. Some have drifted away. Several have moved away. The Church Buildings Reopening Committee will still have to meet and make decisions. But that's where faith comes in.

Faith. Hebrews 11:1 says: "*Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.*" This is an anxious time for Russ and me. There are not only the concerns about his health but there also are significant financial concerns for our family since leaving 18 months early will impact my social security and Pension. But that's where faith comes in for us. So Russ and I walk out in faith, assured and with the conviction that God will be with us still.

Faith. Matthew 21:22 records Jesus as having said: *"Whatever you ask for in prayer with faith, you will receive."* The church also has concerns about the pandemic related lower attendance and financial giving. That's where faith comes in for First Christian Church too. But just as God has seen this congregation through the Civil War, the Spanish Flu, the Great Depression, a fire that led to the sanctuary having to be rebuilt, desegregation, the Vietnam War, the Civil Rights Movement, various controversies, ministers and congregants coming and going, and this recent pandemic, God will continue to be with you and work through you. God is your anchor, God's love surrounds you with every breath you take, and God will see you through, as you walk out in faith.

While I am so sad to be leaving, I know that God has great things in store for you! I am so excited for you! You will go on to write the next chapter in the history of this church. You especially will be remembered as those who were called to shine the light of Christ from the corner of Fifth and Main during an especially difficult moment in our nation's history as you proudly proclaimed the Christian faith, putting it into action through outreach, walking out into the unknown with faith as you had to reimagine what it means to be church in the midst of a pandemic and learned to do things in brand new ways.

I will be with you for the next month and a half. My outward task over this time leading up to August 31, 2022, will be to try to finish well, undertaking all the tasks that I normally do. This will include emptying out and packing up an office that has accumulated not only my things but also houses papers and books and videos belonging to the church that have been stored there since there is little place to put things otherwise. In retirement, I still plan to complete the pictorial account I have been working on that tells the story of how the church navigated through this pandemic. It is designed to be a historical record for future generations and I will get it to you when it is completed.

My inward task and internal struggle is bit by bit to try and let go, fully understanding that the success of my successor partly depends on how well I do this. This, actually, is an ethical requirement. Our denomination's Ministerial Code of Ethics, which I adhere to, states that I am to help with the future success of the church by:

"Encouraging the ministry of my successor upon my retirement or other departure from a ministry position, without interfering or intruding, and by making it clear to former parishioners that I am no longer their pastor nor will I perform any pastoral services unless requested by the congregation's current pastor and elders."

Because of this stated and necessary ethical requirement, even though Russ and I plan to make Murray our permanent home (while taking as many trips down to Florida to see our daughter and grandchildren as still will be possible), I will not be able to continue to worship or participate at events at First Christian Church unless, at some future date, an invitation is extended to me to do so by the minister and elders. I know that many of you have asked me to do your funerals. I will only be able to do this if such a request is made formally by your future minister and elders.

In closing, I thank you from the bottom of my heart for the huge blessing each and every one of you has been in my life and that of my family. It has been an extraordinary journey and I have felt loved and supported by you every step of the way. I will continue to keep you in my daily prayers and will be cheering you and your future minister on from the sidelines. I leave you with this quote, which has sustained me so often during my life, written by the English anchoress Julian of Norwich (1342-1416):

"All shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well ... For there is a Force of Love moving through the universe that holds us fast and will never let us go."
