There are other things to which to adapt. Some of us may need to use a cane, a walker or a rollator. once again, pride gets in the way. We do not want to show the world we have gotten this old.


We have to adapt to losing friends- to transitioning from this world, to those who move to be near children, to dementia. SAD

A FINAL NOTE FROM PASTOR RUTH

Dear Church Family and Friends,

Thank you from the bottom of my heart for making my last Sunday with you such a memorable occasion, one that I will look back on for the remainder of my life as one of the most bittersweet days in my life. Bitter, of course, because it is so difficult for me to say goodbye to the most wonderful congregation in the world that I have grown to love so much over these past 13 ½ years, fully realizing that to help make the ministry of your next pastor more successful, I must distance myself from the church starting this Thursday when my actual retirement begins. It is also bitter in part because my retirement comes earlier than expected due to the rapid onset of my husband Russ's symptoms from Inclusion Body Myositis. Yet I fully embrace and walk into this new reality, knowing that there still are adventures to be had, ways to put my faith into action, and that there is no place in this life or the next where we can be separated from the love of God in Jesus Christ.

Yet, in spite of the bitterness, there was so much sweetness this past Sunday. Sweet because I was accompanied across the threshold into retirement and the mystery of an uncertain future with all your blessings, prayers, support, and love. Not every pastor has the privilege and experience of this kind of positive departure. It meant so much to me to see so many of you in worship on Sunday and to have special friends and congregants come from a distance for worship and/or the retirement reception following. A number of people joined us virtually on Facebook Live. It was wonderful to have our administrative assistant Katelyn Crane there, even though she was immediately pulled into work mode by being asked to run off extra bulletins since we were not planning on such a large attendance (thanks Katelyn!). Some colleagues and former staff members also were present.

Indeed, there were so many sweet moments along the way! Thank you Rebecca for your communion message, and Charlotte, Ann, Dan, and Amy for your kind words during the farewell portion of worship. Thank you to our wonderful, hardworking West Area Minister Rev. Rachel Nance Woehler, for bringing words of appreciation from the Region to honor both my husband Russ and me as we both officially retire. Thank you to Judy Hill and Janet Finch for playing all my favorite music. Thank you to the congregation for putting up with singing my favorite hymn "Draw Us in the Spirit's Tether," which I know many of you don't like, but its melody and words have profoundly shaped who I am as a Christian. This hymn has been a soundtrack to my life dating back to my childhood days worshiping at Memorial Church on the Harvard University campus, later as an adolescent in Canada and on through the future; it was sung on my ordination day, in all the churches Russ and I have pastored, and finally on this past Sunday of my retirement. Thank you to our faithful Minister of Music Mark Dycus and the wonderful Chancel Choir for putting into music what is the deepest knowing of my spirit, namely that "It Is Well With My Soul." Thank you for listening to yet another one of my sermons (by now you will have listened to over 600 and I am fully aware that mine tend to be long so know how much I appreciate your patience!). Thank you for the beautiful wooden cross with the FCC plaque on it, and all the cards with their beautiful messages, and the many gifts both monetary and otherwise. Since many of the gifts were anonymous let this be a collective THANK YOU to all of you!

A FINAL NOTE FROM PASTOR RUTH

Thank you especially for the laying on of hands and prayer for me and my family at the end of worship. It was through this ancient spiritual act that I was ordained, was installed in a number of churches, and it was with this same sacred gesture that I now move into retirement.

And the reception! WOW! Such beautiful decorations, such beautiful flowers, such perfect food (I loved the cake with the red Chalice on it), and so many people from the church and community were there. The fellowship hall was filled. Never for a moment could I have imagined so many people would show up to add their blessings to my retirement celebration, especially on a day when there were so many other things going on. Special thanks to the reception team who worked so hard to put this together and who stayed to clean up afterwards. Your efforts and all the special touches were noticed and greatly appreciated. It was the icing on the cake to have Nikolas Winslow and his two-year-old daughter Finley (the only infant baptism I have ever had the privilege of performing) drive all the way in from St. Louis to surprise me at my reception!

I could go on and on (you know how long winded I am) but let me end where I began by saying that I thank each and every one of you from the bottom of my heart for accepting me as your minister and supporting me along the way. I leave you with these lyrics to my favorite hymn that convey how I have felt while I have been with you (and you can listen to a rendition of it from the Global Christian community by going to this Youtube link https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ldLU-6U5XDc, which, of course does not come close to the joy that I always feel in singing it with the congregation at First Christian Church and I know would be sung even better by our Chancel Choir!):

"Draw us in the Spirit's tether, for when humbly in your name two or three are met together, you are in the midst of them. Alleluya! Alleluya! Touch we now your garment's hem.

As disciples used to gather in the name of Christ to sup, then with thanks to God the giver break the bread and bless the cup, Alleluya! Alleluya! so now bind our friendship up.

All our meals and all our living make as sacraments of you, that by caring, helping, giving, we may be disciples true.

Alleluya! Alleluya!

We will serve with faith anew."

Update from the Search Committee

The pulpit search committee has been working diligently since the middle of August. We have met frequently and continue to work on filling out our congregational profile which we need to have on file for potential ministerial candidates. A big thanks to those individuals who have helped with this process even filling in some sections on their own!

We have distributed a demographic survey with the congregation and are beginning to analyze the data it provided. Further surveys will be coming to look at what characteristics we are looking for in a minister. Judy Lyle has been helping with the surveys.

We just finished three "dream and plan" meetings on two different days. We had 27 people in attendance at those meetings. Furthermore, we have even started working on some initiatives because of these discussions. Be on the lookout for a new and updated brochure on the church – a big thank you to Erica Gray. We are also exploring the idea of church t-shirts in the future.

Soon, the committee will analyze the input from the "dream and plan" meetings in order to answer questions on section XI, congregational discernment. We will also look at possible compensation packages for interim and our settled minister.

We have interviewed a potential candidate for the interim minister position and are continuing to pursue the possibility of hiring.

We have the pulpit filled with a variety of speakers through the end of December so we have breathing room in our search.






Saturday, December 24, 8:00 PM ~ Christmas Eve Candle Lighting and Communion Service


Sunday August 28, 2022 ~ Pastor Ruth's Last Service at FCC Murray
