#### Update from the Search Committee

The pulpit search committee has had a busy three months. With the help of the congregation, we were able to obtain the information we needed to complete the Congregational Profile and sent it off to the regional office in Lexington. We also interviewed two candidates for the position of interim pastor. We chose to offer the position to Chris Owens who is off to a great start. We have a one-year contract with Chris, but it has a clause that would allow us to give him 60-days notice if we find and call someone for the full-time settled minister's position before that. As most ministers would need to give their congregations a two-month notice the timing would work out.

We are looking forward to a second meeting with our regional minister, Dr. Don Gillett, and our west area minister, Rachel Nance-Woehler concerning our next steps in our search. Our congregational profile will be shared with ministers who are looking for a position and match up with our criteria. This is likely to be a long process so continue to pray for God's leading in this search.



# During the months of October through December 2022, our church participated in the following outreach efforts:

- ✤ On October 2<sup>nd</sup>, World Communion Sunday, we took a special offering for the **Disciples Mission Fund** (designated to support all 72 ministries of our denomination). \$496.35 was received and a check was sent on 11/27/22. I want to thank everyone who contributed to help fund all of these wonderful programs.
- ★ The packing party on Sunday, October 23<sup>rd</sup> for the Little Acts of Kindness Bags was a HUGE success. I want to thank all who donated items, especially David Robinson who has been collecting all year long. I want to thank Celeste McAllister for sewing all of the bags. I want to thank the twenty individuals who stayed after worship on October 23<sup>rd</sup> and assembled 156 bags. Four of those bags had extra items added and were given to four girls that families are being helped by HOPE Calloway. Those four bags and twenty more were delivered to HOPE Calloway on October 27<sup>th</sup> by Melanie Dawson. Ann Thornton delivered 32 bags to the hospital (16 to the ER and 16 to the pediatric unit) on October 27<sup>th</sup>. Want to make contact with other agencies and deliver more bags. - ✦ Contributed money (\$250) to Laundry Love for our month of November. Due to COVID, we no longer work at the laundry mat but lwash cards are given to families through the school's resource centers. Twenty cards are loaded with \$12.50 each and distributed (10 each) to the Murray and Calloway schools. We still partner with St. John's Episcopal Church and First Presbyterian Church for Laundry Love.
- ★ Thanksgiving food boxes were delivered Friday (11/18/22) to provide meals for 15 families. Appreciation to <u>Bradley Dawson</u> and <u>David Robinson</u> for delivering the food to Needline for their distribution. A huge thank you to the Food Giant staff for compiling and boxing all the items for distribution at no charge. The costs for the project averaged out \$69-70 per family. We need to also thank Rebecca Landolt for always organizing this program for our church. (See picture in the JOYS section)






